



Update on SAGEEP 2020 / 1st Munitions Response Meeting

The Symposium on the Application of Geophysics to Engineering and Environmental Problems (SAGEEP) and the 1st Munitions Response Meeting have been rescheduled for March 14-18, 2021 at the Hilton Denver City Center hotel in downtown Denver. We thank and extend our appreciation to all those involved and everyone who intended to join us at SAGEEP this past March. We look forward to seeing you in 2021.

Frequently Asked Questions:

- Does this mean that SAGEEP 2020 and the 1st Munitions Response Meeting are cancelled?
No, SAGEEP 2020 has been rescheduled for March, 2021. SAGEEP 2020 was not held in Denver, Colorado USA in March/April 2020 due to COVID-19 health concerns and orders banning congregation of groups. Authors and organizers put together an exceptional technical program that will be realized next spring as SAGEEP 2021.
- Will SAGEEP and the 1st Munitions Response Meeting be held in Denver in 2021?
Yes, SAGEEP 2021 and the 1st Munitions Response Meeting will be held in downtown Denver, Colorado USA.
- Will my registration fee be applied to the rescheduled SAGEEP/1st Munitions Response Meeting in 2021?
Yes, all those who registered for SAGEEP 2020 or the 1st Munitions Response Meeting will have their fees applied to the conference in 2021, including student registrations. This includes fees for luncheons, the student event, the field trip, and the conference evening event. Retaining these fees makes it possible for EAGE to perform the many functions necessary to produce a high quality event in 2021.
- What about short course fees?
Short course registrants for SAGEEP 2020/1st Munitions Response Meeting will have their fees transferred to the short course offering of their choice at SAGEEP 2021 or in the future. Our goal is to maintain continuity to 2021 offerings but the course topics may vary. Therefore, registrants will have the opportunity to request that their short course fees be returned at SAGEEP 2021 if they do not find a suitable option among the new offerings. Keep an eye out for several that may be offered as virtual classes in the meantime.

- Will accepted abstracts be transferred to the conference in 2021?
 Yes, all abstracts that were accepted for SAGEEP 2020 or the 1st Munitions Response Meeting will remain approved for the conference in 2021. Authors will also be given the opportunity to update their abstracts. No additional fees are necessary for existing approved abstracts.
- I have conflicts and will not be able to present my talk/ poster during the rescheduled dates. Can I withdraw my abstract?
 SAGEEP 2021 and the 1st Munitions Response Meeting will allow abstract withdrawals as needed for those who are unable to attend and present during the March 15, 16 and 17, 2021 dates. Abstract submission fees are non-refundable.
- Will there be an opportunity to submit new abstracts?
 Yes, this will be possible. A call for additional abstracts will be posted in the autumn of 2020.
- I can't attend SAGEEP/1st Munitions Response Meeting in 2021. Can I transfer my registration fee to someone else in my company?
 Organizers are excited about the program and opportunities they planned and hope that all those who registered for 2020 can attend the rescheduled conference in 2021. In the event that is not possible, a registration will be transferable to another person within the same company, organization or school. Authors presenting a paper or poster who are registered but cannot attend SAGEEP 2021 can transfer their registrations to a co-author, even if the co-author is from a different organization or company. Students who have graduated since registering for SAGEEP 2020 as a student can attend the meeting in 2021 with no additional charges.
- I need my registration fees returned to me. What should I do?
 We understand these are difficult times. Therefore, as has been the policy in all previous SAGEEP meetings, the EEGS board of directors and partner, EAGE, will consider, on an individual basis, written appeals for returning funds to those with extenuating circumstances.
